Introductions & Welcome – David Klinkose

IPS Transportation & Afterschool Programs

Gene Moore & Denise Whitfield, IPS Transportation

- Mr. Moore asked what ACI members would like to know from IPS Transportation. ACI members stated that transportation is a huge budget expense that impacts the number of children they are able to serve. They asked if IPS buses could drop students off at afterschool sites (with parent consent). Providers with before school programs and daycare centers asked if IPS buses could pick students up before school too.
- Mr. Moore discussed the complexity and challenges of accommodating these requests, especially due to the high mobility of students, the constant changes in requests from parents, the budget shortfall, among other issues.
- With this being said, Mr. Moore stated that if an afterschool site is on the same bus route a child typically takes home, it is possible for the child to be dropped off at an afterschool location. **Providers must submit their transportation requests to Mr. Moore directly for consideration—IF YOU HAVE ALREADY DONE THIS, YOU NEED TO DO IT AGAIN, as some logistics have changed. - Students can also be potentially picked up at before/afterschool sites located within IPS boundaries if parents initiate a change of address for the student. Principals can help with this process.



- Mr. Moore made the following recommendations for providers using other transportation companies: make sure they have good drivers with background checks; use credible companies, probably the larger ones. A list of IPS approved bus vendors is attached.
- ACI members asked Mr. Moore if he would write a memo explaining the policies and procedures for transportation requests to program sites. Mr. Moore said that he will meet with his team to see how they can best respond to these needs. He will then put the information in writing for ACI to distribute.

MCCOY's database is for central Indiana, and focuses on all youth-related programs and services. Both organizations will create reports highlighting gaps in services and other information.
